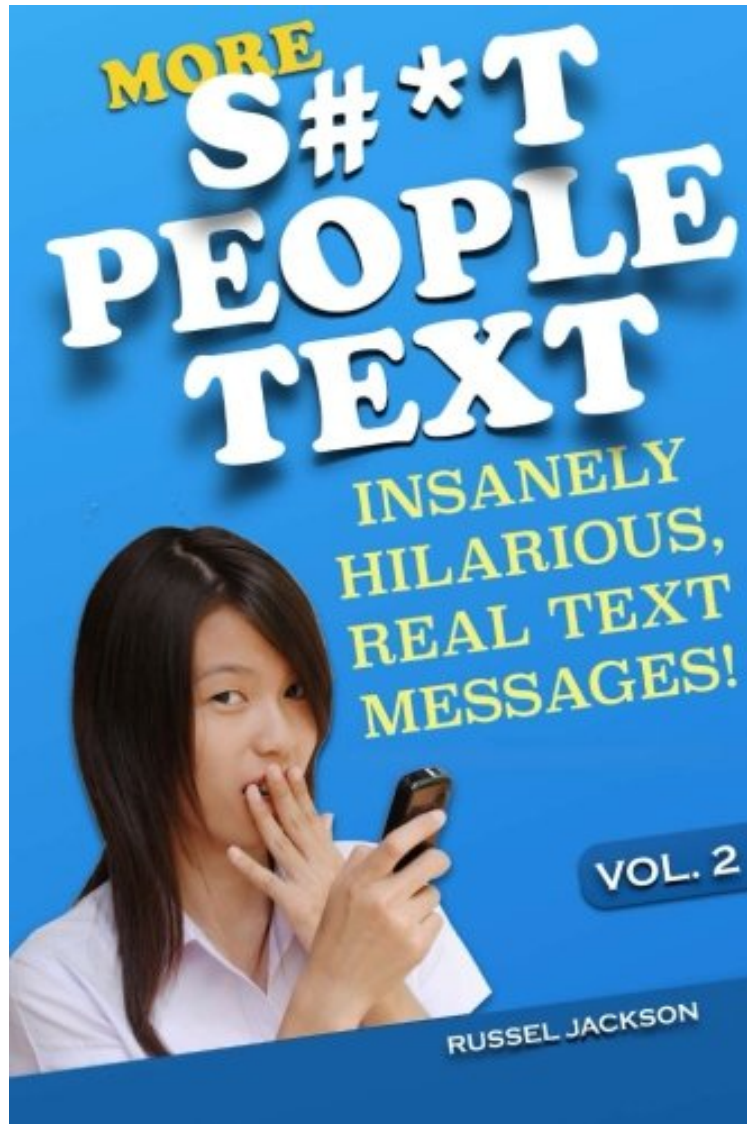

funny, so I checked out a few collections hoping to find a couple of winners. "More S#!@ People Text, Vol. 2" isn't a big winner. It has some good points, but overall doesn't measure up to other autocorrect/crazy-text-tricks books I've been reading. Of course, my opinion is based on my own sense of humor; this collection just didn't click for me. But I'm sure some people will find it hysterical. My main problem with the book is that it's actually not much of an autocorrect collection (which is what I expected.) Then I noticed that the cover says "Insanely hilarious, real text messages!" so I suppose that could mean all sorts of humorous texts, not just autocorrect errors. In that case, my misunderstanding. But even assuming the book is meant to contain some variety, I still just don't find too many of the exchanges funny. Out of the 105 pages of the book, only about 25 carry true autocorrect messages – The ones that take a normal conversation and twist it an unexpected way. And a number of items are repeats that can be found in other collections. The rest of the book contains puns, jokes, bad pickup lines, etc. We're talkin "Your momma" jokes and pickup lines like "You must be wearing space pants cuz your ass is out of this world." Uh... seriously? For me, those types of things were yawn-worthy by middle-school. There *are* some truly funny moments in "More S#!@ People Text, Vol. 2." I just wish the humor was more consistent. I do think the unique messages – the ones I haven't seen elsewhere – tend to be the funniest. And the *responses* to confusing, perverted, or nonsensical texts are often what really makes the humor work. (I've always been jealous of those people who can find the perfect comeback so effortlessly!) The messages are typed in variously-sized boxes, with italics and bold representing the people talking. This format does look a bit plain, but makes the text much easier to read than in small screenshots or messages shrunk to fit an "phone/iPod" graphic. A few of the text boxes split in awkward places when viewed on my Paperwhite. They end up being half on one page and half on the next. I can't correct this on the Paperwhite, but was able to fix most occurrences in Kindle for PC. "More S\*\*\* People Text, Vol. 2" does have much less swearing and graphic sexuality than some other collections I've looked at, though it's definitely still at least PG-13. So... I don't have of a snappy closing statement here. My opinion of the book is sort of in the middle range. Don't hate it. Don't love it. It will never be a favorite for me personally, but I can see how others might enjoy the variety of different types of conversations. So my best suggestion is to take a look at it. Check out a sample, get it free from the library if you have Prime, or borrow it from someone who has it. The price isn't bad if none of those options work for you and you want to just buy. I would suggest maybe looking around a bit first, though.
